



Denark Construction Awarded Its Fifth Project in Georgia



Denark continues to successfully compete in the Georgia market. Denark completed the Deerfield Village retail center in November 2001 and the LaGrange College Dormitories project in September 2002. Since then, Denark has been awarded three different school projects.

Denark competed against six large southeast contractors and was awarded the \$23 million Dutchtown High School project. The 266,400 square-foot project includes a new high school, sports facilities, concession stands, and a green house. About

20 miles south of Dutchtown High School, Denark is building the new 95,151 square-foot Luella Elementary School. Denark competed against nine Georgia contractors for this \$8.3 million project. This is the second Manley, Spangler, Smith-designed school Denark will be constructing for the Henry County school system.

Denark was selected for the third school project, the Owens Store Road Middle School in Cherokee County, based on the "Best Value" selection process. Denark's management approach, professionalism, ethics, and on time performance were evaluated along with our competitive bid. Denark competed against five other large southeast contractors for this \$16.3 million, 174,286 square-foot Manley, Spangler, Smith-designed project.
