NEWS-SENTINEL SELECTS DENARK!

KNOXVILLE, TENNESSEE – After an extensive evaluation process, *The Knoxville News-Sentinel* selected Denark Construction, from a field of six top area firms, to serve as construction manager at-risk for the newspaper's new plant and editorial headquarters in Knoxville.

Pre-construction and design-phase work on the 165,000 square foot, \$45 million project is well underway. "The new facility will include a new printing press and other equipment that will allow The News-Sentinel to get more late-breaking news ... into the paper," notes a newsletter published by *The News-Sentinel*.

The project will be the anchor tenant in Knoxville's Center City Business Neighborhood Redevelopment Area. The City of Knoxville begins grading of the site in early 2001; construction by Denark is scheduled for a spring 2001 start, and the first newspapers should roll off the presses in the first quarter of 2003. The local office of Lockwood Greene will develop construction documents and handle construction administration.

Denark Construction's team is proud to have been selected and looks forward to completing this important new facility for the *The News-Sentinel* – as promised – on time and on budget.
